

Declaration on Counterfeit, Fraudulent and Suspect Items (CFSI) and Nuclear Safety Culture

The BGH Group stands for the highest quality and integrity in all processes. Protection against risks is a top priority, especially in safety-critical industries such as the nuclear, aerospace and defence industries. Two key issues here are CFSI (Counterfeit, Fraudulent and Suspect Items) and nuclear safety culture.

What does CFSI mean?

Counterfeit, fraudulent or suspicious items pose a significant threat to the safety and reliability of equipment. We are aware of these risks and do everything in our power to keep such items out of our supply chains and processes.

Our measures against CFSI:

- Strict supplier strategy: We only work with verified, trustworthy partners who can prove the origin and quality of their products.
- Binding purchasing guidelines: All goods are sourced exclusively directly from the manufacturer or through authorised distribution channels.
- Training and awareness: Employees in purchasing and production are comprehensively informed about CFSI risks.
- Consistent approach: Suspicious items are isolated, destroyed and not returned to prevent them from re-entering the supply chain. Customers are informed immediately.

Nuclear safety culture – our highest standard:

We are committed to meeting the high requirements of nuclear safety at all times. This includes:

- Only trained employees are assigned to safety-critical products.
- Transparent communication and consistent compliance with all legal and customer-specific requirements.

CFSI is an integral part of our risk management system. All suspected cases are documented and processed in our compliance management system.

Our whistleblower system allows employees to report violations of CFSI and nuclear safety culture rules confidentially and anonymously – an important contribution to prevention and transparency.

Our goal:

Through these measures, we not only ensure the quality of our products, but also the protection of people, the environment and critical infrastructures. For us, security is not an add-on, but a central component of our corporate policy.
